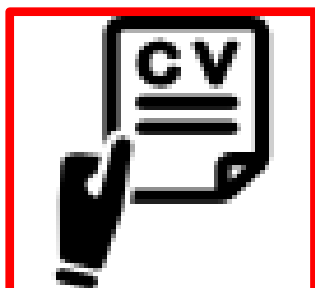

For pupils aged 15 and 16, this includes sixth form or college application writing workshops.
